# Safeguarding (and Training) @ St Catherine's

#### **HISTORY**

When the current chaplain arrived in April 2018, it was to be informed that Stuttgart was one of the remaining 2 chaplaincies in all of Germany that had not completed its safeguarding training. That was put right by the end of September that year with a Saturday spent gathered around a diocesan trainer with very nearly all volunteers across a range of roles, taking part in the varying levels of training required.

#### 2021

In the 3 years since then three things have happened. There are some roles / responsibilities, that have changed 'hands'. All safeguarding training needs to be renewed every 3 years and that brings us to 2021. A pandemic struck forcing a different modus, which has resulted in training being delivered Online and Virtually.

#### TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

Basic Awareness – by anyone who does anything regularly in the Chaplaincy. Foundation Course – required by any working with young people of any age Leadership Course – by Wardens and Safeguarding Officer and Team Leader of young people's ministry plus any of the officiating clergy.

The very first time you do some of this training (that first click of the 'here' on C0) The page you are taken to 'Welcomes you to the Church of England National Safeguarding Team's online learning portal'

It asks you to click on the button (in the Church of England colour purple)

# 'Create new account'

click the button

read the list around data protection and click blue button at the button

'I agree to the Safeguarding Training Privacy Policy'

fill in all the boxes with your information

invent a username and password that you can remember the very last box in the 'more details' section is entitled 'Country' here you get to choose use the little arrows at the right hand side to find **Germany** 

last cluster of boxes -

ignore the question about training institution (leave it as **Not part of a Training Institution**)

Diocese - again use the little arrows down the side to scroll

Go to very nearly the end of the list

**Europe** is what you need to click on

European Country is **Germany** (use the little arrows to find)

Chaplaincy – again use little arrows to take you to

**Germany Stuttgart St Catherine** 

Write in what your church role is eg Sunday School Team or leave this blank Click blue button '**Create my new account**'

You will never need to do this again Every time you log in - the site will remember you!

## Useful Tip

If you are part way through an Online Course and the doorbell rings and you have to stop The next time you log on it will take you to where you stopped – you will NOT need to start from scratch

#### CONCLUSION

Keeping everyone who comes through our doors (virtual or physical) safe, regardless of any qualifyers, is an important part of who we are at St Catherine's.
